

Child support payments through income withholding

Most court-ordered child support payments are made through income withholding – when an employer deducts child support payments from an employee's paycheck. If your payment is not made by income withholding, other payment options are available.

The parent paying support can set up recurring automatic withdrawals from a checking or savings account.

What happens if I don't make all my payments on time or in full?

All of the actions below can occur if you don't pay on time and in full:

- 10% interest per year will be charged on your unpaid balance
- Other income may be intercepted, including, but not limited to:
 - State or federal income tax refunds
 - Unemployment benefits
 - Workers' compensation benefits
 - State disability benefits
 - Lottery winnings
 - Insurance settlements
- Your driver's license and/or professional license may be suspended
- Liens may be placed on your property and bank accounts
- Your passport may be denied
- The unpaid balance may be reported to credit bureaus
- Other legal enforcement actions can be taken

Remember to pay before the 17th of each month to ensure that payment is applied to the intended month.

How are child support amounts determined?

Child support amounts are based on the parents' monthly income and the amount of time the child spends with each parent, as well as other factors. The child support commissioner or family law judge sets the amount of a child support order based on state guidelines.

All income is taken into consideration and can include:

- Wages from a job
- Tip income
- Commissions
- Bonuses
- Independent contractor income
- Unemployment benefits
- Disability and workers' compensation payments
- Department of Veteran Affairs disability payments
- Interest income
- Dividend income
- Rental income
- Social Security or pensions
- Any payments that become due such as lottery winnings and insurance payouts

My situation has changed, can I get my child support changed?

If your income, medical insurance, custody arrangement or other situation has changed, child support orders can be changed as well. This is called a "modification" and must be filed with the court.

You should contact the child support agency handling your case and request a review and adjustment. You may also go to court on your own, with a private attorney, or the Family Law Facilitator's office in your county.

Many child support offices and some courthouses have a payment kiosk, which accepts cash, credit and debit cards, and e-checks. You will need:

- Your state ID or driver's license,
- OR your Social Security Number (SSN),
- OR your Participant ID, which can be found at <https://childsupport.ca.gov/customer-connect>

Allow 3-4 business days for processing.

1.9% fee for credit/debit

Payment requires:

- Participant ID and SSN,
- OR Participant ID, Date of Birth, and Name

Allow 2-3 business days for processing.

 **PayPal \$3.95 minimum or 2.49% fee**

You will need:

- Participant ID number (SSN is optional)
- PayPal account

No more than 3 business days for processing.

Apple Pay, Google Pay, Venmo



Free after \$2.50 registration fee

Convenience fee: 2.95% (max \$60)

Allow 2-4 business days for processing.

In-office kiosk (see left)

No fee for cash

- You will need your Participant ID number
- Use Receive Code 14630

Bank Account Direct Debit **Free after \$2.50 registration fee**

Allow up to 10 business days for processing.

TouchPay  **2.7% fee**

- Download in the Google Pay or Apple App Store
- Accepts Mastercard, Visa, Discover, and American Express
- Allow 3 business days for processing

If you don't have a Social Security Number, your Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN) can be used in place for payment processing.
